


## ISAHAH

- > Tradition says he was sawn in two in a tree!












Jonah, Amos, and Hosea in the Northern Kingdom (Israel)

# ISAIAH

### The Work of a Prophet



The ordinary Hebrew word for prophet is *nabi*, derived from a verb signifying "to bubble forth" like a fountain.

nabu, "to call, " is helpful in suggesting that the passive meaning may well be "one who is called [by God]." If the verb is taken in its active form, the prophet is "an announcer [for God],"

The English word comes from the Greek *prophetes* (profetes), which signifies in classical Greek *one who speaks for another*, especially one who speaks for a god

# ISAHAH

### Two Tests of a Prophet

#### Deuteronomy 13:1-5

...you shall not listen to the words of that prophet or that dreamer of dreams; for the Lord your God is testing you to find out if you love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul.

#### **Deuteronomy 18:20-22**

When a prophet speaks in the name of the Lord, if the thing **does not come about** or come true, that is the thing which the **Lord has not spoken**. The prophet has spoken it presumptuously; you shall not be afraid of him.



### The Work of a Prophet



Exodus 7:1-2

Then the LORD said to Moses, "See, I make you as God to Pharaoh, and your brother Aaron shall be your **prophet**.

2 "You shall speak all that I command you, and your brother Aaron shall speak to Pharaoh that he let the sons of Israel go out of his land




#### **ISAIAH TIMELINE**
